



PROFESSOR DONALD M. BROOM

Emeritus Professor of Animal Welfare, Cambridge University, Department of Veterinary Medicine



Donald has developed concepts and methods of scientific assessment of animal welfare and studied: cognitive abilities of animals, the welfare of animals in relation to housing and transport, behaviour problems, attitudes to animals and ethics of animal usage. He has published over 300 refereed papers, lectured on animal welfare in 43 countries and served on UK (FAWC, APC, Seals) and Council of Europe committees.

Donal has also been Chairman or Vice Chairman of EU Scientific Committees on Animal Welfare 1990 – 2009 and a member of the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) Scientific Panel on Animal Health and Welfare until June 2012. He chaired the O.I.E. group on Welfare of Animals during Land Transport.

Amongst his eight books are *Stress and Animal Welfare*, *The Evolution of Morality and Religion*, and *Domestic Animal Behaviour and Welfare*.
